



Information for passengers arriving to Turkey from abroad

- 1) **As per the latest regulation issued by the Turkish government, as of June 1, 2021**, passengers who will travel to Turkey from abroad (except for the United Kingdom and the countries defined in Article 3) are required to present one of the following documents:
 - A Negative PCR test result taken within the last 72 hours before arrival
 - A negative rapid antigen test result taken within the last 48 hours before arrival
 - A proof of vaccination at least 14+_ days before the date of travel
 - A documentation of recovery from the Covid-19 infection in the last 6 months

- 2) Passengers arriving from the respective countries might be subject to a PCR test performed by the Turkish Ministry of Health upon arrival. Passengers with a positive test result will have to go under quarantine for 14 days at a place of their choice. Quarantine can end if the PCR test result taken at the end of the 10th day of the quarantine is negative. Passengers presenting a vaccine or immunity certificate will be exempt from the quarantine procedure.

- 3) Passengers who have been to Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Brazil, South Africa, India, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka in the last 14 days are required to submit a negative PCR test result conducted within the last 72 hours before arrival. Respective passengers will go under quarantine for 14 days in places to be determined by the Governorships, and a PCR test will be performed at the end of the 14th day of the quarantine. If the PCR test result is negative, the quarantine measure will be terminated.

- 4) Passengers arriving from the United Kingdom are required to present a negative PCR test result conducted within the last 72 hours before arrival. An antigen test result or a vaccine/immunity certificate is insufficient.

- 5) All transfer/transit passengers are exempt from presenting test result or vaccine/immunity certificate requirements.

1. Passengers must complete a "Declaration Form" before departure at <https://www.gateway2jordan.gov.jo>. This will generate a QR code which must be presented before boarding and upon arrival.

2. Passengers must have health insurance valid for the period of intended stay.

This does not apply to:

- nationals of Jordan;
- passengers with a diplomatic or special passport and a diplomatic QR code and their family members.

3. Passengers entering or transiting through Jordan must have a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point. The test result for passengers arriving from Egypt, Iraq, Palestinian Territory or Turkey must be issued by an approved laboratory, details can be found at <https://www.visitjordan.gov.jo/Labs-List.html>

This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 5 years;
- passengers with a diplomatic or special passport and their family members;
- passengers returning to Jordan with a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken before departing Jordan. The test must have been taken at most 120 hours before arrival.

4. Passengers are subject to a COVID-19 PCR test upon arrival which must be paid before departure at <https://registration.questlabjo.com/> if traveling to Amman (AMM), or at <https://COVID19.biolab.jo> if traveling to Aqaba (AQJ). Passengers must have an electronic receipt with a QR code confirming the payment.

This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 5 years;
- passengers with a diplomatic or special passport and a diplomatic QR code and their family members;
- passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate issued by Australia, Austria, Bahrain, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, China (People's Rep.), Chinese Taipei, Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland (Rep.), Italy, Japan, Jordan, Korea (Rep.), Kuwait, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malaysia, Malta, Morocco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Oman, Poland, Portugal, Qatar, Romania, Russian Fed., Saudi Arabia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Tunisia, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom or USA showing that they were fully vaccinated. The vaccination certificate must be in Arabic or English.

5. Passengers must complete a "Passenger Health Declaration Form" and a "Locator Form" and present it before departure.
